



## Living History Events

### Re-enactor Guidelines, Rules, and Registration

Jesse H. Jones Park & Nature Center (JJP), a Harris County Precinct 4 park facility under the leadership of Commissioner Jerry Eversole and park director Darlene Conley, sponsors two main living history festivals each year: **Homestead Heritage Day** in February and **Pioneer Day** in November. Additional living history programs are offered throughout the year and include pioneer campfires, Second Saturday Settlers, Homestead Hoedown, and An Old-fashioned Christmas.

All programs and events at JJP are free of charge and open to the general public.

**Homestead Heritage Day, Saturday, February 13, 2010 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.:** showcases many aspects of pre-1900 Texas history, including "Native American," Anglo settlement, Texas Revolution, Mexican/Spanish heritage, Civil War, and cattle drive times.

**Pioneer Day, Saturday, November 13, 2010 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.:** highlights the Anglo colonization era and Texas Revolution. Volunteers and historians portraying "Native American," Anglo, Texian, and Mexican lifestyles bring the pre-1840 Texas to life.

All efforts are made to differentiate the eras of each event, and advance registration is required to assist the park staff in the planning and enhancement of these events.

Both events tentatively feature an informal outdoor **period-style barn dance** for re-enactors and homestead volunteers in period dress. Live music and a contra dance caller help us strut our stuff settler style. If held, the dance is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. in the homestead corral. Please let us know in advance if you would like to participate, as this event is only held if there are sufficient participants.

**Venue overview:** JJP is situated along Spring Creek, and the Redbud Hill Homestead is located within the forested park grounds.

- The Redbud Hill Homestead depicts an early Anglo settler homestead in the forested eastern portion of Austin's Colony. The homestead structures include a single room log cabin, outhouse, smokehouse, bread oven, root cellar, settler kitchen garden, pig pen, chicken coop, corn crib, barn and corral, woodworking shop and a blacksmith shop.

- A replica Akokisa-Ishak Indian village is located adjacent to the homestead, with a chickee, brush arbor, chief's hut, sweat lodge, and council lodge.
- A mountain man encampment with several period tents is set up during the festivals.
- The green-space at the park entrance hosts period crafts and live music.
- The Homestead Trail is designated for pedestrians and also serves as a handicapped visitor shuttle route.
- Tractor-pulled hayrides are available during festival hours, and connect the main parking lot and the back entrance of the homestead.

#### **Re-enactor Guidelines and Miscellaneous Items:**

- Friday and Saturday night camping in designated areas is permitted for re-enactors with period tents and accoutrements only. Reservations are required, as space is limited. Call (281) 446-8588 or e-mail [jjp@hcp4.net](mailto:jjp@hcp4.net), for more information.
- Park entrance gates close one-half-hour prior to park closure. Park hours are from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., November and February; 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., December and January; and 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., March through October. Anticipated late arrivals should contact the park prior to the event and coordinate gaining entrance after park hours. Please call Monte Parks at (281) 446-8588 during regular work hours to make arrangements for after hours entrance.
- The Jesse Jones Park Volunteers' (JJPV) policies require all re-enactors to be in costume within one-hour of arriving at the campsite to enhance the weekend's atmosphere.
- Firewood is provided; please practice safe fire rules and keep all fires supervised and contained within the existing fire rings.
- Modern rest rooms and showers are located near the homestead.
- Please take heed of natural hazards such as extreme temperatures, tripping hazards like exposed roots, insects including mosquitoes, venomous arthropods and snakes, and poison ivy.
- Lunch for registered re-enactors and volunteers is served on the day of the event in the homestead, and in the front of the park near the nature center.

- A military skirmish is planned for both events (Homestead Heritage Day: Civil War/Runaway Scrape, or possibly both; and Pioneer Day: Texas Revolution/Runaway Scrape). The public will view the skirmishes from the side of the homestead green. A safety officer from each re-enactment group—military, volunteer militia, and rangers—will oversee and enforce safety rules. All non-combatants, **including photographers** must be behind the safety line. Please observe and follow staff instructions.

**Festival Participation Rules:** Camp gear, accoutrements, and clothing including that is worn by participants' children must represent the festival's time period. Every effort to conceal non-period items during festival hours needs to be made. Modern, synthetic material shoes such as tennis shoes (especially light-ups) and flip-flops are not allowed, and period-appropriate shoes are strongly suggested!

**Pioneer Day (1830s):** Homestead participants are required to wear **pre-1840 period appropriate** clothing during festival hours.

**Homestead Heritage Day (many historical eras):** Participants are asked to accurately represent their "character in time." Please **do not** add future time periods to your costume and accoutrements.

#### **Festival Policies:**

- The county has a NO SOLICITING POLICY. You are welcome to discreetly network your business, but the sale of items on county property is prohibited.
- NO PETS!
- Do not litter! Please use the trash cans provided, or carry your trash out of the park.
- NO VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED on the homestead green or campgrounds! The attached map shows three arrows indicating access roads that end at the homestead. Vehicles are not allowed beyond these points. Wagons and carts are available for "use and return" from these homestead/camp entrances to deliver your belongings to your campsite.
- After unloading vehicles, follow the signs for designated parking areas for re-enactor parking. Overflow parking is at the front of the park.
- In addition to completing and returning the attached registration form, all volunteers and reenactors wishing to display or use edged or black powder weapons must review and sign the Weapon Policies document.

- NO VEHICLES ON ACCESS ROADS FROM 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (The tractor-pulled hayrides need the entire road). Vehicles not parked in the marked volunteer parking area are subject to towing at the owner's expense.
- A mandatory pre-event/skirmish safety meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m. for all combatants and re-enactors demonstrating black-powder weaponry. All non-combat re-enactors, "skit participants" and all weapon carriers are encouraged to attend as well.
