Shorebirds and Other Bird Species of the Upper Texas Coast

Tuesday, November 3, 2009 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
(Rain date: Tuesday, November 10, 2009)

Led by birding expert Glenn Olsen this fall birding trip departs from Mangum-Howell Center located at 2500 Frick Road, Houston. For directions, please call (281) 591-7830.

The first stop at Galveston's East Beach is a great place to spot gulls, terns, and other shorebirds. From there, it's on to Bolivar Flats, a bird sanctuary for thousands of birds. Other areas to be visited are Fort Travis, Bob's Road, and Rollover Pass at Gilchrist where Marbled Godwits, American Avocets, and Red-breasted Mergansers may be seen. Open areas can be very windy and cold, so dress warmly.

Participants should bring a sack lunch, drinking water, binoculars, insect repellent, an umbrella, folding camp chair, and a jacket on all trips. Comfortable walking shoes are a must.

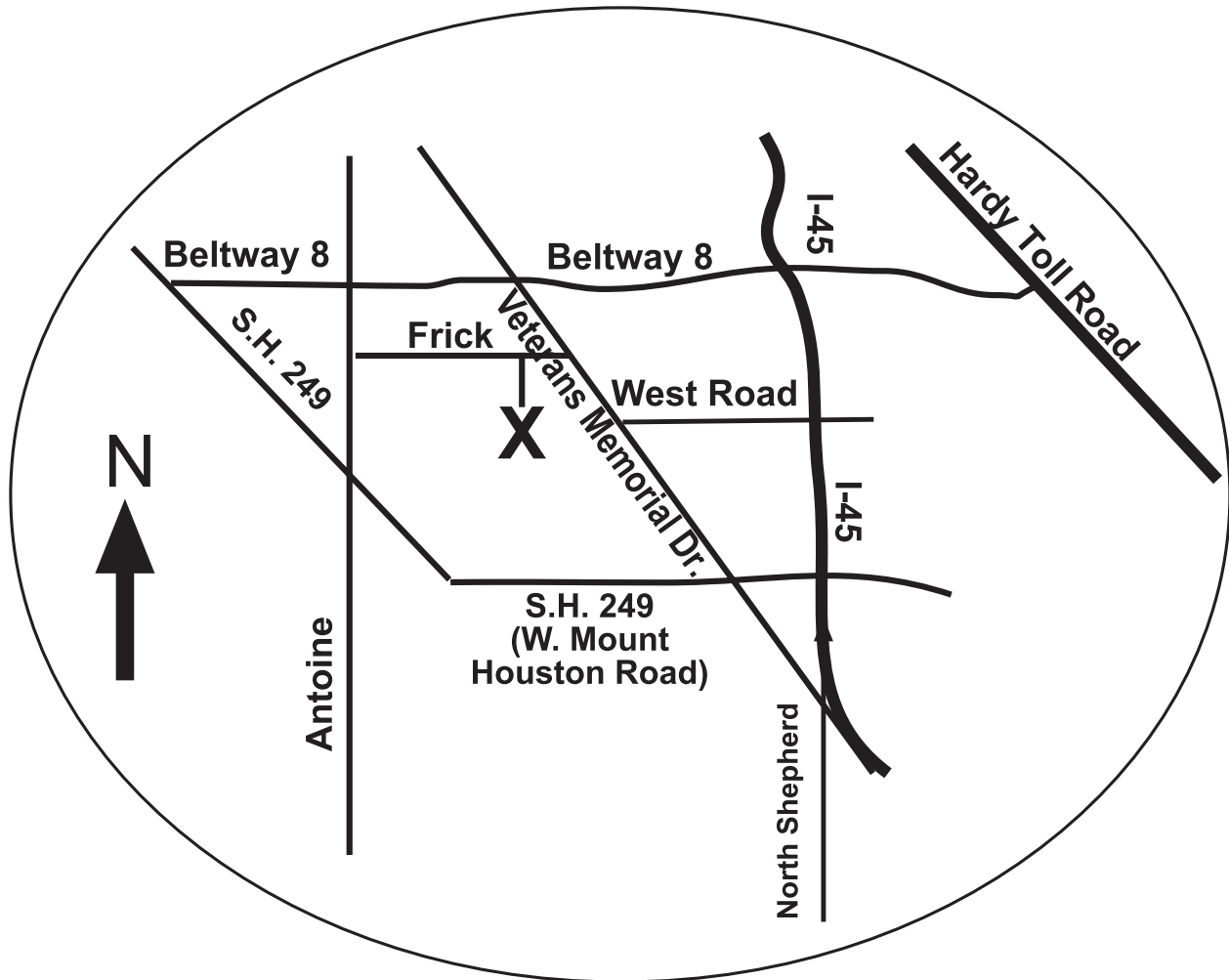
Transportation is available for 22 individuals per trip, ages 50 and better. Prepaid registration is required and can be made by calling Precinct 4's Senior Adult Program, (281) 893-3726, ext. 47. Participation is on a first-come, first-served basis with Harris County residents receiving priority.
